All Around Tote Supply List

Please have the following cut, fused & labeled before class!

For pieces with interfacing ξ fleece, fuse interfacing first then fuse fleece.

Supplies:

Sew Many Creations All Around Tote pattern <u>(required)</u> (Refer to pattern cover for yardage and additional supplies!)

Cutting:

From Outside Main fabric cut:

- A (2) 23" wide x 9" high strips for top front \notin back
- B (2) 23" wide x 7" high strips for large pocket fronts
- C (2) 8" wide x 6" high strips for small pocket fronts
- D (2) 7" wide x 7 1/2" high strip for flaps

From Outside Pocket Accent fabric cut:

- E (2) 23" wide x 7 1/2" high strips for large pocket accent
- F (2) 8" wide x 6 1/2" high strips for small pocket accent

From Outside Bottom fabric cut: G (2) 23" wide x 6 ½" high strips

From Handle fabric cut: H (2) 6" x WOF strips

From Lining Fabric cut:

- I (2) 23" wide x 15" high strips for lining
- J (2) 15" squares for zippered pockets
- K (2) 17 1/2" wide x 10" high strips for center divider

From Fusible Interfacing cut:

- A (2) 23" wide x 9" high strips
- B (2) 23" wide x 7" high strips C (2) 8" wide x 6" high strips
- H (2) 6" x WOF strips
- I (2) 23" wide x 15" high strips
- K (2) 17 1/2" wide x 10" high strips
- D (2) 7" wide x 7 ½" high strip
- G (2) 23" wide x 6 1/2" high strips (if using cork you will still need this!)

From Fusible Batting cut:

- D (1) 7"w x 7 1/2"h strip for flap front Fuse to ONE flap piece on top of interfacing
- K (2) 17"w x 9 1/2" strips for divider Fuse on top of interfacing, centered

There is a template included with this pattern for the flap. I recommend making a photocopy and holding on to the original so you always have a copy with the pattern. I like to cut mine out of cardstock, carboard or template plastic for durability.
